

OBSTACOOOL FUNDRAISER

WEDNESDAY 6 NOVEMBER 2019

Student Parliament, in collaboration with the P&C, are thrilled to be coordinating the “*Obstacool Course*” event as our major fundraiser for this year.

Designed with fun and safety in mind, the Obstacool course includes a range of obstacles that are both challenging and fun. Suitable for kids of all fitness levels, the course has been designed to allow participants to run at their own pace. The course itself is made up of a giant mix of inflatable obstacles together with timber walls, tunnels, rock walls, commando nets and stepping stones. The ‘Hero’ of the course is the main inflatable- *The Big Bopper*, a 40 metre long giant inflatable with many jumps, hoops, spiders web and 3.5m slide at the end.

Children in years P-2 will each have 30 mins on the course with students in years 3-6 having 45 mins, with one year level participating at a time.



This is the **major** fundraising project and all monies raised will go towards playground upgrades and building a new “sensory garden” in our outdoor learning environment.

Today, each student will bring home an official *Sponsorship Form*. This will act as their identity card when asking for sponsorship and collecting sponsor money. Fundraising is based on donation only, not per lap.

Please ensure that your child’s name and class are on the front of the card. This Sponsorship Form, along with all funds raised, **MUST** be returned to your child’s teacher by Wednesday 30 October.

This year the children will have seven weeks to collect their sponsorship money. All *Sponsorship Forms* **MUST** be returned by Wednesday 30 October whether or not your child has obtained sponsorship for the event. **The class who raises the most money will have an extra half an hour session all to themselves on the Obstacool course!**

We are looking forward to another successful KPS fundraising event and we thank you and our local community for their ongoing support.
